Since the last issue of TTT, all supporters will have received a letter outlining the new plan for *Tornado*'s extended overhaul. Whilst we are all disappointed not to see the locomotive back in steam this autumn, we hope that you understand the reasoning for this.

That being said, the engineers in both Loughborough and Darlington are working hard to get the locomotive back into working order. We were delighted to receive the driving wheel sets from South Devon this week, and the team at LMS is now focusing on getting them cleaned up, painted and reunited with the frames. The refurbished boiler is due to be inspected later this month, with delivery shortly after.

In Darlington, the superheater header has been tested, the smoke box door needle-gunned, prepped and painted, and many other components have seen attention, keeping both staff and volunteers busy! And just adjacent to DLW, the new building that we are due to call home in 2023 is rising from the ground.

We are thankful to all of Tornado's supporters for their continued patience and patronage though this

major overhaul. As *Tornado* faces another 6 months away from main line duties, all contributions are gratefully received.

DLW2 - A New Home For The Trust



The new home for the Trust is going up at great pace. The 'end box' is the admin office on the top floor. The plant room and meeting room on the middle floor then the ground floor is the stores nearest to the camera and showers & changing etc beyond. The 'stick' out to the left will be the engineering office and the public gallery. They both cantilever over the workshop 7.5m out.

The steel framed structure is going up rapidly, with the roof less than a month away from installation. Because of the pace of the build, we have a dedicated article in our news section of the website which is updated - almost daily at the moment! - with the latest from the build.

To make the new building work for our locomotives, we need to contribute towards the onsite facilities, including a vital main line rail connection and short running line. Fundraising for the track will begin next week and we would be delighted if you would consider making a donation to help future proof the activity of the Trust in Darlington.


THIS WEEK IN DARLINGTON
