NEWS BRIEFS

• 'PLANDAMPF' ON THE SETTLE & CARLISLE RAILWAY - When the Trust was first approached in late Summer of 2016 about running a 'Plandampf' on the truncated Settle & Carlisle route, it seemed a wonderful idea but unlikely to happen. To run planned steam in lieu of scheduled DMU services is not easy; costs are higher, standard ticket prices have to apply and steam isn't as swift as modern traction, especially when more capacity is added to accommodate demand. However, at a meeting in early December momentum started to build and Northern MD Alex Hynes coined the phrase 'I ♥ S&C'.

Network Rail was 100% supportive and pulled out all the stops to ensure that the trains rain as well as possible. An idea first mooted by Nigel Harris and Tony Streeter of Bauer Media might just happen.

For the Trust to be asked to develop the plan, and seek to bring industry partners together is a great honour, and shows the esteem *Tornado* is held in by the industry. DB Cargo's new CEO came on board and backed the venture agreeing to run the trains for a reduced fee. From the green light being given, to *Tornado* departing London for Appleby, was five weeks. It really showed what can be done when the industry works together.

Northern have reported that between 5,500 and 6,000 people travelled on the trains, and there were many thousands at the lineside. Tourist spots such as Appleby Castle, which would have been closed, were open. The hotels, bars and restaurants were full in the area every lunch time and evening. The media still came to witness the event and it reached as far as the Czech Republic, Malta, America and Australia. The BBC were still following the story, and the beautiful sound of *Tornado*, on the following Sunday.

Paul Barnfield, Regional Director at Northern, said, "*Tornado's* visit to the Settle and Carlisle line has been fantastic. During the three days more than 5,500 people travelled on the steam services and it was great to see so many Northern customers entering into the spirit of the celebration. This was the first timetabled steam service in England for almost 50 years and to be able to bring *Tornado* to such an iconic and visually stunning line, as a way of saying thank you, was a genuine pleasure." Paul added, "I'd like to give my thanks to all partners who made the event possible. Running a 21st Century timetabled steam service is unprecedented in England and though there were challenges along the way, there is no doubt that *Tornado's* visit was a remarkable success."

Richard Corser, DB Cargo UK's Account Manager for Charters, Special Trains and Resource Hires, said, "We were delighted to collaborate with our rail industry colleagues on these historic services. It was wonderful to see how enthusiastically the local communities welcomed the trains, from school children to older generations. And it goes without saying that we're very proud of our DB Cargo UK train crew for No. 60163 *Tornado*, with their combined experience of approximately 80 years working on steam locomotives they made sure the passengers had a journey that they're sure to remember fondly for many years to come."

Douglas Hodgins, Friends of the Settle & Carlisle Line Chairman, added, "This has been a sell-out success and a huge credit to all those involved. There must be lessons here about the demand for steam, scenery and rail travel in general. It was the perfect curtain raiser for the re-opening of the Leeds-Settle-Carlisle route on 31st March."

• 'THE SAINT DAVID' ON WEDNESDAY 1ST MARCH - A day of very mixed fortunes for *Tornado* and her support crew! This ambitious tour was to take No. 60163 from Paddington to Cardiff via Bristol Parkway and return via Gloucester, Sapperton and Swindon, however, things got off to a bad start with the locomotive and support coach trapped at Stewarts Lane by the failure of a GBRf freight train leading to a 67 minute late departure from the depot. The delay was cut to a 48 minute late departure from Paddington and the DBC crew had reduced this to a little over 20 minutes by the time the train called at Swindon. However, a further pathing delay added 35 minutes to the

schedule but despite this 'The Saint David' arrived in Cardiff just 15 minutes down. All credit to the DB Cargo crews who performed wonders to regain time and adjust planned crew changes to fit round the disrupted timings. A full frontal assault on Sapperton Bank in the pouring rain only added extra sparkle to what proved to be an eventful day out!
