NEWS BRIEFS

• FIRST 90MPH RUN NEXT APRIL - On 14th April next year *Tornado* hauls 'The Ebor Flyer' from London to York, her first scheduled train timed for 90mph running. Recreating the glory days of express steam travel, this train will follow the LNER route out of the capital heading north to collect passengers from the popular

M25 railhead of Potters Bar, before roaring onwards passed the historic rail hub of Doncaster to York. Steam hauled throughout, the return journey promises to be as thrilling as the outward. On the route south passengers can be assured of a swift journey as the train travels down Stoke Bank, the location where *Mallard* broke the world steam speed record of 126mph in 1938. Tickets for this train are expected to sell quickly and passengers are advised to book early to ensure their place on the first 90mph *Tornado* railtour.

• A NEW HOME FIT FOR AN A1! - We are delighted to announce plans for a new multi-million-pound main line connected base in Darlington. If its fundraising attempts are successful, the new site will be operational in time to play a central role in the celebrations marking the 200th anniversary of the opening of the Stockton & Darlington Railway in 2025.

At the heart of the new base will be the four-track Whessoe Road engine shed which was built by the Stockton & Darlington Railway in 1861. Designed by William Peachey, it was one of the S&DR's last developments before the company was absorbed by the North Eastern Railway in 1863. The shed went on to serve as a wagon repair and paint shop, before falling into disuse in the late 20th Century. You can read the full story here.

ONE LAST PUSH TO GET (A TENDER) BEHIND TORNADO

The last few months have seen tremendous progress in our campaign to raise £200,000 to pay for No. 60163 *Tornado's* tender. Membership of the extended 163 Pacifics Club has grown steadily since its launch in September 2013 and at the time of writing, 168 Pacifics have already found new shed allocations and over £200,000 pledged, leaving only 42 remaining for sponsorship. With *Tornado* having attained the magic 100mph and scheduled to haul her first 90mph train, 'The Ebor Flyer', on 14th April 2018, let's complete the project we embarked upon in 1990 through the purchase of No. 60163's tender before the start of her 10th birthday celebrations in August 2018.

How you can help:

We need to raise £200,000 by 2021 to purchase *Tornado's* tender. Following the success of our Regular and Dedicated Donation schemes for the construction of *Tornado*, the Trustees have on a similar method for the purchase of the tender. However, instead of "an A1 for the price of a pint" and "use your loaf", we've decided to raise the funds in a different way, "The 163 Pacifics Club". Although *Tornado* carries the number '60163', her pre-nationalisation LNER number would have been '163'. If 163 people were to donate £10pm over the eight years until we need to purchase the tender (or alternatively make a one-off donation of £960) with the addition of Gift Aid (£2.50pm or £240 one-off) this would raise £195,600. Due to popular demand, an additional 46 'Pacifics' were released from the Raven class A2s, Thompson classes A2/1s, A2/2s, A2/3s, Peppercorn class A2s and Gresley class A4s (including destroyed No. 4469 *Gadwall*). One supporter has chosen to sponsor the 'honorary Pacific', Gresley class W1 4-6-4 No. 10000/60700 which was un-named but also had 6ft 8in driving wheels.
